Planned Giving Scheme



GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Wisdom:

The ability to discern God's will and purpose in all things, to apply knowledge to the practical aspects of life, and to see the true value of things.

Understanding:

The ability to grasp the deeper meaning of God's word and to appreciate the mysteries of faith.

Counsel:

The ability to give wise advice and guidance, to discern the best course of action in difficult situations, and to offer sound judgment.

Fortitude:

The strength to persevere in the face of adversity, to stand firm in one's faith, and to resist temptation.

Knowledge:

The ability to understand God's will and purpose, to discern truth from falsehood, and to apply knowledge to daily life.

Piety:

The ability to live a life of reverence and devotion to God, to love God with all one's heart, and to care for one's neighbours.

Fear of the Lord:

A reverence for God that leads to a desire to please Him, to obey His commands, and to live a life of holiness.

FRUIT OF THE HOLY SPIRIT (Galatians 5:22-23)

Love:

A self-sacrificing, active love that prioritizes others' needs.

Joy:

A deep and abiding joy, even in difficult circumstances, that comes from the Holy Spirit's presence.

Peace:

A sense of calmness and tranquillity that comes from being in harmony with God.

Patience:

A willingness to endure difficulties without complaint, showing forbearance and understanding.

Kindness:

A compassionate and considerate attitude towards others, reflecting God's mercy and grace.

Goodness:

A moral excellence that stems from the Holy Spirit's work, demonstrating integrity and uprightness.

Faithfulness:

A loyalty and dedication to God, to others, and to promises made.

Gentleness:

A meekness and mildness, showing strength under control, and a willingness to deliver truth with love and humility.

Self-control:

The ability to restrain emotions and impulses, demonstrating wisdom and discipline.
